How far has Africa progressed along the road to achieving cultural independence since the granting of formal independence in the late 50s and the 60s? Perhaps one indication is that the problem is now widely recognized as existing, whereas in 1960 to paraphrase Nkrumah, the political kingdom having been achieved, it was felt all else would follow. Today rarely a day passes without a newspaper carrying an article on the need to reassert Africa own cultural values.

Yet in the early 60s only a small group of academics and artists together with a handful of systematic expatriates seemed aware of how deeply Africa's cultural life was dominated by foreign cultural ideals especially in the educational system.

With the approach of independence African lecturers in many universities in Africa challenged the orientation of much of their curricular, for example in history where African history was excluded unless it concerned European activities in Africa.
